



## Long Term Solution

- Reduce teacher absenteeism
  - Excused/unexcused; extended leave (maternity/bereavement); late; present but not in classroom; in classroom not teaching
- Reduce pupil absenteeism
  - Collaborate with parents; health and social welfare services.
- Reduce class size
- Distribute a Minimum package of Teaching and Learning materials
- Better teaching


## Short term solution: Catch Up classes

 With support from USAID Jifunze Uelewe and UNICEF, MOEVT plan to implement Catch up classes in all schools to address the issue of foundational skills (Reading, writing and Arithmetic)

• All learners in standards 1-6 can perform foundational skills (Reading, writing and Arithmetic) at the level of that standard.

 Plan to provide on-going support through the catch-up classes commencing in July 2024

## What will be the focus of the Catch-up Classes?



#### Catch Up Classess Implementation Steps

Identification of Pupils

- Conduct Group Administered Learning Assessment (GALA) to standard two Pupils in February and August (National) and identify pupils below the "pass" mark.
- Use learner-specific assessment (Tangerine Teach Software) to group children based on needed skills.
- The selected teachers from another school (Priority Mathematics and Kiswahili) will administer classroom assessments.

Orientation of Teachers

- Employed Standard 1 to 6 Teachers teaching Kiswahili and Mathematics
- The content will give teachers full autonomy for deciding instruction but focusing grouping pupils by skills (skill-targeted instruction)
- The training content will encourage using available materials such as decodable, levelled readers and non-fiction books

Classroom Activities implementation

- Timing: Schools must set a minimum of 2 hours per week
- Catch-up Class Implementers ( Head Teachers and Standard 1 to 6 Teachers

#### Catch Up Classess Implementation Steps

• There are no time limits, and pupils will be supported until they reach the right level.

**Graduation Criteria** 

• School Catch-Up class Implementation plans should specify results within a given time frame, and teachers should be prepared to meet these objectives.

**Follow up and Support**
