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Background of the study

- The use of Edtech in library activities - Read aloud and Shared reading.
- The benefits of Read Aloud and shared reading - linguistic, cognitive, and social emotional benefits.

Literacy Cloud in Tanzania

- In **Tanzania** – Started pilot implementation 2021 to December 2022
- Covered 20 primary schools within Tanga Region (Tanga city, Korogwe, Muheza & Handeni districts)
- The project inputs were:
 - **Teachers** - provided with relevant trainings and continuous technical assistance for successful utilization of the platform
 - **Schools** – provided with 1 tablet, 1 projector, 1 projector stand and internet connection

Pilot study (questions & methodology)

- Monitoring tools
- Used **mixed method approach**
- Data was collected throughout the year
- The study intended to answer the following **questions**:
 - How can Literacy Cloud enhance foundational reading skills and cultivate a habit of reading?
 - To what extent does Literacy Cloud strengthen digital adoption of read-alouds and shared reading?
 - Does the Literacy Cloud improve access and utilization of digital reading resources in schools?

Results of the Study

- Enhanced learners' involvement in reading
- Gives parents/ community access to learning
- Positive response from stakeholders
- Teachers high interest and enthusiasm in integrating LC
- Cost efficient
- Equipping teachers and teacher librarians with skills (especially digital skills)

Challenges

- Unreliable infrastructures supportive for the edtech project implementations
- Unreliable electric supply
- Limited ICT skills among majority teachers across schools
- Less strategic project sustainability plans among schools

Recommendations

1. Providing proper infrastructure is in place in schools to support Edtech
2. Setting strategic plans for teachers' continuous professional development - technology related skills and facilitation of library activities
3. Integrating Edtech partners and digital platforms in existing government Edtech platforms for ease of utilization of Edtech in Library activities.
